# Item 8. Inaugural meeting of EPIC (Environmental Projects in Clackmannanshire)

JJ gave an update on the progress of EPIC which is the successor to the Ochils Landscape Partnership (OLP). The OLP was funded by Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) monies and Windfarm monies. Three projects in and around Muckhart were funded:

Muckhart Nature Park

Kirkyard Project

Upgrading and maintenance of the Hillfoots Way

Currently EPIC has funds from Clackmannanshire Council and Windfarrm money to support the maintenance of the 22 OLP projects for 10 years. EPIC is hoping for more funding to support small projects and continue to help projects through the deployment of volunteers.
